F.B.I. Director's Community Leadership Award

Castro Community On Patrol (CCOP) in partnership with our colleagues at Community Patrol Service (CPS) developed the San Francisco LGBTQ+ Community Safety Program to provide Active Shooter training, information, and resources to the business. bar. and nonprofit organizations in San Francisco.

We worked directly with the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) and the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) in developing the training content and were delighted to have both FBI agents and DHS security specialists attend all of our community training classes to provide specific answers to attendee questions.

In recognition of this longterm commitment, Special Agent in Charge, Robert Tripp, of the San Francisco FBI recommended the SF LGBTQ+ Community Safety Program for recognition in the 2024 FBI Director's Community Leadership Awards.

Chief Ken Craig of Community Patrol Service (CPS), Chief Greg Carey of Community On Castro (CCOP), Patrol and Patroller L. Gonzales of CCOP traveled to the FBI headquarters in Washington D.C. to receive the award on Friday April 19<sup>th</sup> from FBI Director Christopher Wray in a ceremony that recognized sixty award recipients from FBI field offices all over the United States and territories.



FBI Director Christopher Wray stated, "Each year, the FBI recognizes citizens from across the country who have worked tirelessly to help their friends and neighbors and to strengthen their communities."

"If we in the FBI have

learned anything, it's that partnerships are critical in our success. We have to work shoulder-to-shoulder with our law enforcement and intelligence partners here at home and overseas. But we also have to work closely with the citizens we serve. As leaders in your communities, you know the problems facing your community better than anyone. We all have the same goal - to keep our communities safe - and the best way to do that is by working together. Thank you for your service, vour dedication, and your commitment, and congratulations on your welldeserved awards."




"We were surprised, humbled, and honored to be selected for this incredible recognition," said Chief Ken Craig of CPS.

#### SF LGBTQ+ COMMUNITY SAFETY PROGRAM RECOGNIZED BY LOCAL LEADERS AT CITY HALL



In addition to the incredible recognition by the FBI in April, our local San Francisco leaders also recognized Chief Ken Craig (CPS) and Chief Greg Carey (CCOP) at a special awards ceremony held at City Hall on Monday March 18<sup>th</sup>.

Mayor London Breed presented both Chief's with a Certificate of Honor at the ceremony attended by Supervisor Rafael Mandelman, District Attorney Brooke Jenkins, Sheriff Paul Miyamoto, Chief Bill Scott (SFPD), and Special Agent in Charge Robert Tripp (FBI).

#### CCOP IS NOW A 501(C)(3) NONPROFIT CORPORATION

In our on-going efforts to recover from the sudden collapse of our former fiscal sponsor, CCOP has formed as an independent California nonprofit corporation, and we successfully received our <u>Federal IRS nonprofit</u> recognition which will now allow us to seek corporate and grant funding to continue our work.

#### TWO NEW TRAINEE PATROLLERS JOIN CCOP IN APRIL



Growing our volunteer Patroller numbers is an essential goal for us in 2024, and we were very happy to welcome two new Trainee Patrollers to the CCOP family in April. We currently have three Trainee Patrollers active with us and moving towards full Patroller status, but we honestly need about twenty more to be more effective!

#### **Help Castro Patrol Recover**

Castro Community on Patrol (CCOP) lost all finances including pending City grants when SF-SAFE (it's fiscal sponsor since 2006) came under criminal investigation in January 2024. The result was nearly \$11,000 in unpaid bills and no capital for continued operation. The CCOP Board decided to form its own nonprofit corporation and then rebuild a financial basis to continue its important community services including walking safety patrols, training of the public, and helping other nonprofits develop safety plans. The likelihood of regaining City funding is low for at least the next 2-3 years. In the meantime, CCOP plans to fund its work through private donations and possible corporate grants.


## Community Patrol Service

Castro Community On Patrol (CCOP) seeks new volunteers to help patrol the Castro neighborhood on a monthly basis.

CCOP has successfully patrolled the Castro neighborhood since 2006, deploying in teams of three unpaid volunteer Patrollers who walk for a 3-hour shift which they select themselves.

Our patrols provide assistance, distribute information, offer guidance, and deliver support to the residents, businesses, and visitors of the Castro, interacting with thousands of people every year. We are often "First Reporters" by calling in Medical, Fire, or Law Enforcement professionals when needed, and we will offer assistance when safe to do so until the professionals arrive.

CCOP also assists other community groups to make their events successful, and we are often a part of the developing history of the LGBTQ+ community. In the past we've assisted at PROP8 rallies, Pulse Nightclub memorials, Harvey Milk annual events, and many others. We also assist at regular community events by providing safety teams to events such as the Sisters Easter in the Park, SF PRIDE safety events, Castro Street Fair, Glow in the Street events, CBD Music in the Plaza, Santa Skivvies Run, PRC Holiday Dinner and many more.

Our volunteers are mostly members of the LGBTQ+ community, but we are open and welcoming to **ALL** who want to volunteer just three-hours a month to help keep the Castro neighborhood a little safer. We provide full training, and you will always deploy with experienced volunteers. Patrolling is fun, you get to meet lots of people, and you can feel good about helping out the community.
