

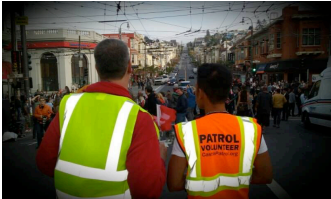

CCOP IN REVIEW



2015 was a busy, productive and successful year in so many ways for CCOP.

CCOP provided approximately 1, 269 hours of patrolling activities in 2015 in support of the community in general. We also provided countless additional hours of service at public and neighborhood meetings and non-patrol functions.

We participated in 29 community support events including:

We completed the year with a total of 24 Patrollers on our books, however of that 24 only 12 are Active and the remaining 12 are currently classified as Inactive as they have not patrolled in three or more months. It is a credit to all of our Active Patrollers that we have achieved so much with such limited personnel resources. You are truly amazing.

Since we began recording Patrol hours contributed on behalf of the community in 2011, CCOP has contributed a total of around 7, 128 hours.

We hosted six new trainee certification classes throughout 2015, training a total of 27 new Patrollers and re-certifying 16 existing Patrollers. Unfortunately many of the new Patrollers did not complete the required four supervised trainee patrols in order to convert to full Patroller status.

Seeking and securing new Patrollers continues to be the most difficult and challenging obstacle we

face as an organization, but we will continue to work on this in 2016.

Six Patrollers Complete Advance ASM Course



active CCOP Patrollers, six of whom took part.

The training focused on the basics of First Aid as well as providing first time, or re-certification, in Cardio Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) and the use of Automated Electronic Defibrillator (AED) devices which are becoming more and more readily available.

In addition to these basics, attendees were also provided instruction of general accident scene management and emergency movement of injured individuals to remove them from a dangerous situation in the safest way possible.

"We envision such free training as a regular annual offering for our volunteers," noted Deputy Chief Ken Craig who is responsible for volunteer training.

While it remains somewhat rare, CCOP has been first on scene at a few accident scenes in our nine year history, so we felt it was important to offer training and certification in Basic First Aid, Automated Electronic Defibrillation, CPR and Accident Scene Management.

The training and certification took place in December with the generous offer of Ptrl. Jeff Johnston's office space on Market Street and was FREE to current and

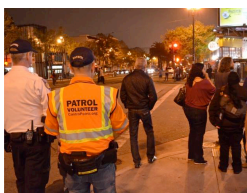
