CCOP HISTORY

Chief Greg Carey, KCCO is the second longest continuous serving Patroller with CCOP.

A graduate of PVBTC 003 in January of 2007, Gregg was quickly snagged to sit on the CCOP Board which at that time numbered some 15 people. When founder Carlton Paul elected to leave CCOP in mid 2007, Gregg accepted the nomination to Chair of the Board and was appointed to Chief of the Patrol in 2010.

STAY AWAY ORDER IMPOSED

Following another incident within the Castro neighborhood, the District Attorney was granted a public nuisance stay away order against Patrick McClellen above.

The stay away order required that the subject stay no less than 50 yards from the intersection of Market Street and Castro Street. If he is located inside that 50 yard exclusion, he is subject to immediate arrest and prosecution.

If you observe the subject within the 50 yard exclusion during the effective period of the stay away order, call the SFPD non-emergency or 911 if the subject is causing problems. Advise the dispatcher of the subjects name and the stay away order number and wait for Police to arrive. Do not engage the subject in any way if you can avoid doing so.

SANCHEZ ST. SUSPECT PHOTO



SFPD have released the above composite sketch of a suspect wanted in connection with the battery of two victims on the 100 block of Sanchez Street at 10:30 PM on February 23, 2016.

The male victim in the battery suffered a broken leg, while the female victim suffered a traumatic brain injury.

The primary suspect, shown above, was the only one engaged in the battery but three others stood and watched the battery, and fled with the suspect.

We have increased patrols North of Market Street into the Duboce Triangle neighborhood as a result of this battery and we began distributing "WANTED" posters throughout the area seeking information on the suspect.

We will continue to focus a portion of each patrol on Sanchez Street and into Duboce Triangle whenever possible.

SPFD Park Station investigations team is seeking public assistance in identifying the suspect shown, and the additional three accomplices to this battery incident.

Ask your friends, family, neighbors and co-workers who may have been in the area around that time to contact police. You may have observed a critical piece of evidence without even realizing it.

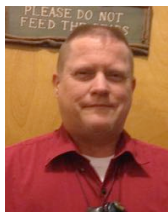

Increase In Commercial Burglaries



At least three businesses we know of have been hit by burglaries, or attempted burglaries, this month alone.

According to an article in Hoodline, Jungle Red salon at 4233 18th was the victim of a burglary on the evening of March 13/14. Zapata Mexican Grill at 4150 18th was hit with an attempted burglary on March 18 at around 2:30 AM which was caught on surveillance camera. It appears the would be burglars were disturbed and they made off before entering the store.

Crystal Way on the 2300 Block of Market Street was the latest burglary victim at around 4:00 AM on March 29th.

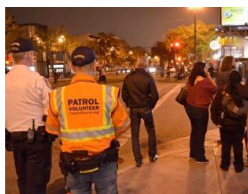
SFPD Mission Police Station is investigating all three cases, but no suspect descriptions have been released to date.
